**Maui Coastal Land Trust Hosts Moonlight Hike
at Waihe'e Refuge on April 10**

For Immediate Release: Wailuku, Maui, Hawai'i — The public is invited to explore Waihe'e Refuge by moonlight on a special guided hike with the Maui Coastal Land Trust on Friday, April 10 from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. The event is open to the public for a \$25 donation, although space is limited. Reservations can be made by calling 244-5263.

Refreshments and snacks will be served before heading out on the easy two-mile walking path. Along the way, Maui Coastal Land Trust project manager Scott Fisher will guide the group through the ancient Hawaiian fishing village of Kapoho while sharing the history, lore, and chicken-skin stories of this special place. Sturdy walking shoes are recommended, and participating children must be 14 years or older. No dogs please.

The Waihe'e Coastal Dunes and Wetlands Refuge is a 277-acre site recently restored by Maui Coastal Land Trust as an environmental, cultural, historic and educational resource. Regularly scheduled day hikes are held on the first Saturday of every month. These events are free and open to the public, though reservations are required.

The Maui Coastal Land Trust is a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving and protecting coastal, agricultural, and culturally significant lands in Maui Nui.
